Individuals will be assessed by NMN staff to identify needs in support of our mission. Those needs are addressed by NMN staff and also by connecting with other local organizations.

We are dedicated to providing services that ensure the physical, mental, spiritual and emotional well-being of anyone victimized by violence.

In the quest to achieve balance and independence, we focus treatment on healing and moving beyond through establishing a support network of both services and resources.

Support Services

For many people, finding the right resources and services they need can be complex and confusing. Our case manager and support service staff can assist you with connecting with the appropriate community resources to meet your changing needs.

Sexual Assault Services

Presence of an advocate is available 24/7 by contacting Tribal Dispatch and requesting the on-call worker. SANE trained nurses are available to perform medical examinations on victims to assist with evidence collection.

Safety Planning

Our staff is dedicated to assisting individuals in preparing to leave violent situations. The knowledge shared on how to safely exit a violent relationship is essential support to victims whose quest it is to become survivors. Leaving is never an easy decision, so allow us to help you feel more prepared with a comprehensive safety plan before you leave. NMN can help with short term emergency shelter and help connecting to other shelter resources.

Education and Outreach

The staff is available to provide education about domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking to providers and community groups. Presentations provided are based upon group needs.
